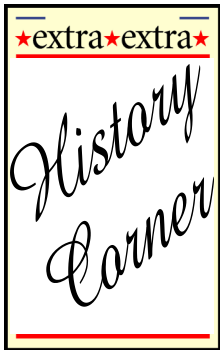

O, CHRISMON TREE

A *Chrismon*, a combination of the words “Christ” and “monogram”, is a symbol that represents Jesus. The very first Chrismon was the **Chi Rho**, a combination of the first two Greek letters of “Christos”, or Christ.

A **Chrismon Tree** is a tree decorated with such common Chrismons as crosses, stars, angels, doves, fish (“ichthus”), and triangles representing the Holy Trinity. Chrismon ornaments can be made from any type of material, whether paper, cloth, or Styrofoam. The Chrismons are often white and gold---white to represent Jesus’ purity, gold to represent His sovereignty. [From briefnet.com]

Mrs. Hal (Virginia) Anderson wrote in her President’s Report of Women of the Church (First Presbyterian, Corinth) 1977-1978 about the Chrismon tree which decorates our sanctuary each December:

“For our Christmas program Mrs. Stanley Hill planned a trip for the W.O.C. to the First United Methodist Church, Florence, AL. There, the 14 members who made the trip were shown the church’s beautiful Chrismon tree and lovely wall hangings of Women of the Bible. The Chrismon decorations and hangings had been made by the ladies of the church.

Mrs. Frank Worsham [Jr.] and her committee secured and decorated our equally beautiful Chrismon tree, which added so much to our sanctuary at Christmas time.”

On November 12, 2017, the Sanctuary Choir sang the offertory anthem that blessed my heart, as I know most of you were also blessed. As with all the choir pieces, the words to "In Christ Alone" rings true to the Word of God, and tells the story of the love of Christ. Here is the first verse:
